



Guidelines for Abstract Preparation

Title of the Abstract: (Font; 14, bold, Times New Roman, centered) Title should be brief, descriptive and should not span more than 2 lines. Capital letters should be used only for the first word and for proper nouns. Abbreviations should not be used.

Authors and Affiliations: The names and affiliations of all authors and the institutional addresses should appear below the title. Type authors' names in capitals, giving each author's initials before the surname (see the template given below). Separate names with commas, except for the last name, which should be preceded by the word 'and'. Font; 12, Times New Roman. Leave a single space between the title and the author's names. Leave no space between the authors' names and the affiliations. When there are more than one author and if they are from different institutions their affiliations should be identified by superscript numbers (see the template).

Identify the corresponding author by an asterisk (*). The e-mail address of the corresponding author should be indicated below the institutional address(es) and should be italicized.

Text/Body of the Abstract: A concise and factual abstract is required. The abstract should state briefly the research problem, the methods, major findings, a brief discussion of the results and major conclusion(s). The abstract should consist of 250-300 words, justified, with no subheadings such as introduction, material and methods, results etc. The use of non-standard or uncommon abbreviations and references should be avoided.

Keywords: Three to five keywords or phrases in alphabetical order, separated by commas. Be sparing with abbreviations: only those firmly established in the field may be eligible.

No references, tables or figures should be included in the abstract.

Language: British English only.

Non-English terms: All non-English terms should be *italicized* (e.g., *et al.*, *viz*, *in vivo*, *in vitro*, *ad libitum* Yala, Maha)

All scientific names should be *italicized*. Both genus and species names should be mentioned at the first appearance and only the species name can be mentioned with abbreviated genus name subsequently.

e.g. *Clostridium botulinum* and subsequently *C. botulinum*.

Software: Microsoft® Word (the template has been provided at the end of these guidelines and can be downloaded from the faculty website).

Page setting format:

- **Paper size:** A4 (210 x 297 mm) typed single-sided only.
- **Font:** Times New Roman
- **Font size:** 12
- **Line spacing:** 1.5
- **Text alignment:** Justify
- **Margins:** 2.5 cm (1") on all sides.

Submission: Abstract should be named according to the format given below;
"author's name with initials_index no_name of the department"

Use the following abbreviations for the department names;

Department of Applied Nutrition: DAN, Department of Aquaculture and Fisheries: DAQF, Department of Food Science and Technology: DFST, Department of Livestock and Avian Sciences: DLAS.

e.g. **KGLPerera_168524_DAQF**

Microsoft® Word version of the abstract prepared by strictly adhering to the aforementioned guidelines along with the supervisor's approval must be emailed to the respective department email address on or before 2.00 pm, Monday, 11th January 2021.
